- 1. CALL TO ORDER: @ 5:30pm by Mayor
- 2. ROLLCALL: Scott Merki (X) Susan Webster (X) Chris Chapman (X) Rose Jackson (X) Elizabeth Skinner (X) John Bohrer (X) Rick Weber (X) Quorum present.
- 3. REVIEW OF MINUTES: Meeting minutes of October 6, 2020 were approved by Common Consent.
- 4. PERSONS BEFORE COUNCIL: Morgan County Economic Development Authority Executive Director Daryl Cowles appeared before Council to correct misinformation in a letter given to the Mayor and Council by the Bath Historic Landmark Commission. Discussion followed with members of the Commission. The Mayor suggested a separate meeting to discuss concerns presented.
