## TOWN OF BATH COUNCIL MEETING

Tuesday, April 20, 2021

1. CALL TO ORDER: @ 5:30pm by Mayor

2. ROLLCALL: Scott Merki (X) Susan Webster (X) Chris Chapman (X) Rose Jackson (X) Elizabeth Skinner (A) John Bohrer (X) Rick Weber (A) Quorum present.

3. REVIEW OF MINUTES: Meeting minutes of April 6, 2021 were approved with one

date correction by Common Consent.

4. PERSONS BEFORE COUNCIL: Nancy Strine of CDBG and HOME Administrator of the City of Martinsburg Community Development Department requested Council consider a three year Agreement (see attached) supporting the programs of the aforementioned organizations. She also presented a Resolution (see attached) authorizing Bath's participation in the Eastern Panhandle Home Consortium of West Virginia for the period of July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2024.

5. COMMUNICATIONS FROM MAYOR: The Mayor explained the Hancock Elementary and Middle/High School closure issues. Discussion was held on the detrimental effects of such action on the entire area. Recorder Webster read a Resolution of opposition to the closures (see attached) she prepared on the matter. MOTION: To approve Resolution 2021-04-02 as amended- Bohrer/Chapman-Carried. The Mayor discussed the Hancock Municipal Election results and his hopes for cooperation and joint ventures to be launched between the communities.

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- 1. BATH DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY: The next meeting is May 5th.

4. RAIL/TRAIL: The next meeting will be April 28th. Co-Chairman Pete Brown presented an update to the Town Clerk's office. WV DOH anticipates funding soon.

5. STREETSCAPE: The next meeting is May 20th. Co-chair Pete Brown described a multifaceted event being planned for April 24th including a celebration of the Congress Street Streetscape project. The Committee presented their recommendation in favor of the Town permitting banners on street light poles owned by the Town. Type of banner, hardware, content and other issues will be decided at a later date.

6. TRAIN DEPOT: Recorder Webster reported that the DOH has sent the Depot Project to the Federal Highway Administration for approval.

7. LANDMARK COMMISSION: The next meeting is April 27th. David Abruzzi described a petition the group is presenting to tourist based businesses. A request by the Recorder to see the petition for the record was denied.

8. CLERK/RECORDER REPORT: Recorder Webster reported that the time period for Announcements of Candidacy for the Bath Municipal Election on June 8th is closed. She presented the list of Election Officials and Alternates for appointment (see attached).
