

## **A TOWN ORDINANCE**

### **ORDINANCE 2015-01**

#### **Sec.26-29 Same-Qualifications**

Any registered voter within the Town of Bath is eligible to serve as an election official in any Town election. No person shall be eligible to be appointed as an election official in any election precinct who is not a qualified voter in the town in which such precinct is situated; or who has anything of value bet or wagered on the result; or who is a candidate to be voted for at the ensuing election; or who is addicted to drunkenness; or who is not of good character and standing; or who has served or acted in the capacity of deputy sheriff within six months prior to the date of holding any such municipal election. In the event that there are not enough qualified individuals to serve as election officials in any election from within the parameters of the Town of Bath after reasonable efforts have been made, the Town Recorder can widen the parameters of the search to include the remainder of Morgan County, West Virginia. The Town of Bath Ordinance on Elections, Article II, Section 26-29; as written, is in accordance with the West Virginia State Statute; Chapter 3: Article 1: General Provision and Definitions, section 3-1-28.
