## TOWN OF BATH COUNCIL MEETING

Tuesday, February 1, 2022

1. CALL TO ORDER: @ 5:30pm by Mayor

2. ROLLCALL: Scott Merki (X) Susan Webster (X) Chris Chapman (X) Rose Jackson (X) Elizabeth Skinner (X) Greg Forney (A) Rick Weber (X) Quorum present.

3. REVIEW OF MINUTES: Minutes of the Regular Meeting of January 18, 2022 were

approved by Common Consent.

4. <u>PERSONS BEFORE COUNCIL</u>: Bath Tree Board Member Kate Lehman requested that Council approve the Tree Board to move forward with a Division of Forestry Grant application. The Board was encouraged to apply by the Division of Forestry to replace certain invasive trees within the main thoroughfare of Town. The amount to be applied for will be no more than \$10,450.00 and any match will be satisfied by inkind contributions so no Town expense is expected.

MOTION: To approve the Bath Tree Board request to apply for the Division of Forestry Grant as presented- Webster/Weber- Carried.

5. <u>COMMUNICATION FROM MAYOR</u>: Appreciation was expressed for the diligence and industry shown by Bath employees during recent and ongoing inclement weather.

The Mayor read an email by Marianna Ruggiero which requested permission to allow Warm Springs Middle School students to use the Fairfax Green for a Poppy Project during the 2022 Memorial Day weekend. The project is fully funded and supported by several other community organizations.

MOTION: To approve the Poppy Project as proposed by Marianna Ruggiero with the stipulation that at the project's end the poppies, stems and any other materials are removed so as not to interfere with mowing and property maintenance-Chapman/Jackson- Carried.

Recorder Webster reported on her actions on the north Wilkes Street paving project. Thrasher Engineering Project Manager Randy Watson visited the site and has provided a preliminary cost estimate of \$250,000.00. Webster has sent Daryl Cowles, Governor Justice's Representative in the Panhandle, all information provided her. Mr. Cowles has moved the request to the Governor's Office for consideration.

Recorder Webster also showed Mr. Watson the WV DOH poorly maintained cross streets of Mercer and Union. Watson will provide a preliminary estimate for that work also.
