TOWN OF BATH COUNCIL MEETING

Tuesday, June 6, 2023

1. CALL TO ORDER: @ 5:30pm by Mayor.

2. ROLL CALL: Scott Merki (X) Susan Webster (X) Chris Chapman (A) Rose Jackson (X) Elizabeth Skinner (X) Greg Forney (X) Rick Weber (A) Quorum present.

3. REVIEW OF MINUTES: Minutes of the Regular Meeting of May 16, 2023 were approved by Common Consent.

4. <u>PERSONS BEFORE COUNCIL</u>: Darren O'Neil, Executive Director of the Morgan Arts Council, presented a request (attached) from this organization for reserved parking for their planned Friday evening music events from June 23rd through Apple Butter Festival, October 6, 2023. The request is for the four parking spaces on the west side of Mercer Street adjacent to the Ice House property from 9am until 9pm on the Friday event days. A prepared letter (attached) of agreement to this request and a waiver of the Town's open container law on the Ice House property for these events was presented.

MOTION: To authorize the Mayor to sign the letter for the MAC request as presented -Jackson/Webster - Carried

5. COMMUNICATION FROM MAYOR: The Trail Depot Grand Opening was May 28 with great attendance and enthusiasm. Recorder Webster also had the Town's newly rehabilitated Depot open for the public at that time.

North Wilkes Street has been paved by the WV DOH. Webster presented a letter of appreciation (attached) for approval to be sent to WV Secretary of Transportation Jimmy Wriston for this project and the multiple Transportation Alternatives (TA) grant projects throughout the Town and County.

Dates for the upcoming Council meetings were discussed relating to the Canvas of the Election on June 19, West Virginia Day Holiday on June 20 and the Certification of the Election on June 21. It was decided that the Canvas of the Election will be Monday, June 19 at 4:30pm, the Certification of the Election will be June 21 at 4:30 and the regular meeting will be June 21 at 5:30.

COMMITTEE AND BOARD REPORTS

- 1. BATH DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (BDA): The next meeting is June 7 in the Courthouse. Recorder Webster suggested that this group consider sponsorship of a Block Party for the newly paved north Wilkes Street.
- 2. PARKS & REC: The next meeting is May 17 in the Courthouse.
- 3. PLANNING COMMISSION (PC): President Landon reported that the regular

monthly meeting of the PC will be June 12 at 9am with the BDA as invited attendees to discuss that organization's role and input in the Bath Comprehensive Plan.

4. RAIL/TRAIL: The progress report has been submitted to the Town office (attached). Significant progress has been made recently with the DOH on this TA grant project. Rebecca MacLeod made Council aware that there is a press event scheduled on June 29th in Ranson to announce organizations which have received the 2023 Green Streets, Green jobs, Green Towns grant awards. MacLeod submitted an application for Parcel 1B for storm water management and plans to attend the event.

5. STREETSCAPE: Committee Co-Chair Pete Brown has submitted reports to the Town office (attached). Council agreed to extend Resolution 2022-06 (attached) from last year to be resubmitted this year. Brown will be attending the Morgan County Commission meeting this Wednesday concerning the Commission support letter for Streetscape. Brown also updated Council on the recent progress on receiving additional funding opportunities for the Berkeley Springs State Park project. Senators Trump and Blair and Del. Miller have become involved with possible solutions.

6. TRAIN DEPOT: Chairman Webster met with Matt Pennington of Downstream Strategies to discuss future plans and funding sources for continued improvements for the Depot property. Webster is working with US Sen. Manchin's scheduler on a time that he could attend a future Depot celebration. She also donated two new Depot

banners.

7. LANDMARK COMMISSION (HLC): The next meeting is August 4, 2023.

8. CLERK/RECORDER REPORT: Clerk Corrick presented Budget revisions for the current fiscal year with accompanying Resolution 2023-06-01 for approval (attached).

Status of Streetscape, State Park and NBRT Projects for Town Council Tuesday June 6, 2023

STREETSCAPE

Phase V: Design Contract:

- Thrasher plans to release the 30% drawings this week. DOH is planning for a Preliminary Field Review in Town in the July 11th timeframe
- The PFR will have more significance than with previous projects. Part of the delay in the 30% drawings is a more thorough review of the Cost Estimate by Thrasher. DOH is planning to determine the appropriate scope of Phase V as a result of the 30% review. The problem here is the high bids that DOH is receiving for similar projects (Like the BSSP Park Project). They do not want to continue to have to find funds to make awards.
- The May 18th Committee Meeting was held and Outcomes are being published. The issue with the 30% Drawings and Cost Estimate and DOH's desire to reduce the scope of the project to fit the current Construction Budget was discussed.
- I believe the current Phase V Construction Budget is: Total of \$534,996 with \$427,997 from the TA Grant and \$106,999 from the Town Cash Match. The Funding Agreement has not yet been formally sent to the Town. These numbers will be verified as part of the PFR.

Phase VI: Design Grant Re-Application:

- Intent to Apply (ITA) application was approved as "Eligible" on May 12th. Final Application is due by June 15th The Application is on-track.
- Plan to submit same basic Phase VI street/sidewalk package for Design Grant Funds. Grant Funding request is
 increased from \$48,000 to \$56,000 (New Total with Match of \$70,000) to account for inflation and specific street area
 issues plus expected iterations of designs to meet Construction Budget
- DOH is expecting a Design Phase Application in FY23 and a Construction Phase Application in FY24

Berkeley Springs State Park Grant & Project

Status:

- Bid opening occurred on April 9th resulted in a low bid of \$578,717; leaving a shortfall to the budget of \$117,950 when DOH additional costs are included (the 13%). DOH offered a chance for 80% of the funding to come from DOH within TA type funds in DOH.
- Awaiting Draft of Supplemental Funding Agreement. Split should be: \$142,360 from DOH TA funds and \$35,590 as a
 Cash Match from new Sponsor funds being provided from State funds to the Town for this use.
- DOH asked that the Sponsor request the \$142,360 amount. This request happened on May 24th.
- We expect that DOH will request the low bidder to extend that bid price 30 days past June 9th (30-days after bid opening.) This is a routine DOH policy when additional funds are being located to fund that bid price. The bidder can refuse this extension request.
- DOH expectation for resolution and award is sometime in July or August.

RFP for Repairs to the Cemetery Mausoleum

- Job Showing happened on May 24th at 4 pm. One contractor (a non-bidder) attended.
- Bid opening is 4 pm in the Town Bldg Tuesday June 6th
- There are specific qualification factors in the RFP that must be reviewed prior to determining an award.

<u>NBRT</u>

- The package has cleared the Right-of-Way review.
- Next step is a formal multi-function virtual review of the NBRT Design/Build Solicitation package set for June 13th at DOH. Once any/all items raised at the review are resolved, the project will be sent for advertising via Bid-X. We will keep monitoring Bid-X for this result.
